

CHILDREN'S MESSAGE



Theme: Expectations of Jesus

Materials:

Scripture: Luke 7:18-35

Hello girls and boys. I hope you had a great week! Today we're going to think about something called expectations. When you go to Disney World what do you expect to see? Mickey Mouse or maybe Minnie Mouse. Maybe you were looking forward to seeing some of the other Princesses like Jasmine or Anna or Elsa. What if you went to Disney and instead saw Snoopy or Scooby Doo? That would not be what you expected when you went to Disney World, would it? We all have certain expectations. Your parents expect you to behave and to have proper manners. They might expect you to always remember to say please and thank you. They might expect you to finish all your supper before leaving the dinner table. They might expect you to finish all your homework before you start to play. We all have a lot of expectations.

We also have a lot of expectations of Jesus too. The man named John the Baptist had certain expectations about Jesus. He thought Jesus would come to finally make things the way they should be, at least according to John. He wanted Jesus to make all the bad people finally pay for their evil things and to reward all the good people for their acts of goodness and kindness. Instead, Jesus healed sick people, gave sight to those who were blind and even raised a few people from the dead. But there was not making the bad people pay for their sins. Instead, Jesus ate with sinners and even with those terrible tax collectors. In other words, Jesus did not live up to the expectations John the Baptist had for him.

We also want Jesus to be and to do certain things in our lives. We don't want to be sick or to be afraid, but sometimes we are. That doesn't mean Jesus doesn't care about you. Sometimes Jesus wants us to do the work of caring for each other. That's why he even gave us a new commandment to love one another. When we do that we are loving Jesus too.

So, let's not be disappointed if you don't always get what you wanted. Jesus came so we could have something even better. He came so we could live with him in heaven forever. That's one expectation that I trust and believe will come true.

Let's pray... Dear Jesus, forgive us when we place our expectations on you. Help us to be your hands and feet for others and to show them how much you love everyone. Amen.

• A READING OF SCRIPTURE: Luke 7:18-35

R: Our scripture reading is from the Gospel of Luke, Chapter 7.

C: Glory to you, O Lord.

¹⁸The disciples of John reported all these things to him. So John summoned two of his disciples ¹⁹ and sent them to the Lord to ask, "Are you the one who is to come, or are we to wait for another?" ²⁰When the men had come to him, they said, "John the Baptist has sent us to you to ask, 'Are you the one who is to come, or are we to wait for another?" ²¹Jesus had just then cured many people of diseases, plagues, and evil spirits, and had given sight to many who were blind. ²²And he answered them, "Go and tell John what you have seen and heard: the blind receive their sight, the lame walk, the lepers are cleansed, the deaf hear, the dead are raised, the poor have good news brought to them. ²³And blessed is anyone who takes no offense at me." ²⁴When John's messengers had gone, Jesus began to speak to the crowds about John: "What did you go out into the wilderness to look at? A reed shaken by the wind? ²⁵What then did you go out to see? Someone dressed in soft robes? Look, those who put on fine clothing and live in luxury are in royal palaces. ²⁶What then did you go out to see? A prophet? Yes, I tell you, and more than a prophet. ²⁷This is the one about whom it is written, 'See, I am sending my messenger ahead of you, who will prepare your way before you.' ²⁸I tell you, among those born of women no one is greater than John; yet the least in the kingdom of God is greater than he." ²⁹(And all the people who heard this, including the tax collectors, acknowledged the justice of God, because they had been baptized with John's baptism. ³⁰But by refusing to be baptized by him, the Pharisees and the lawyers rejected God's purpose for themselves.) ³¹"To what then will I compare the people of this generation, and what are they like? 32They are like children sitting in the marketplace and calling to one another, 'We played the flute for you, and you did not dance; we wailed, and you did not weep.' ³³For John the Baptist has come eating no bread and drinking no wine, and you say, 'He has a demon'; ³⁴the Son of Man has come eating and drinking, and you say, 'Look, a glutton and a drunkard, a friend of tax collectors and sinners!' 35Nevertheless, wisdom is vindicated by all her children."

Today's scripture reading is really three distinct texts. They are related in that they all in some way describe who John and Jesus were, their relationship to each other, and the people's reaction to both of them. There's a lot of really heavy, theological weight contained in these three stories and we don't have the time to delve into all they have to offer. So, I'm going to concentrate on one verse. It's actually a beatitude, just like the ones we find in the Sermon on the mount. (SLIDE) The verse I'm talking about is Luke 7:23, which says, "And blessed is anyone who takes no offense at me." This is part of the answer Jesus gives to the disciples of John the Baptist when they come asking if Jesus is the one John had proclaimed was greater and would baptize with fire and the Holy Spirit. John was looking for and had announced that this "greater one" would come with his winnowing fork and separate the wheat from the chaff, burning the chaff with unquenchable fire. (SLIDE) As John was languishing in prison, waiting for his execution, he was still looking for an almighty Messiah filled with wrath and vengeance. John was waiting for a redeemer who would finally put that "Brood of Vipers" in their place. Now, languishing in Herod's dungeon, John hears about Jesus, eating with Tax Collectors and sinners. He hears about Jesus refusing to condemn and actually forgiving people's sins. He hears about the miracles of healing and even raising a widow's son from the dead. This was not the Messiah he had expected. (SLIDE) Luke tells us Jesus had just then cured many people of

diseases, plagues, and evil spirits, and had given sight to many who were blind. He tells John's disciples to go and tell John what they have just seen and heard. Then Jesus adds this line about being blessed by not being offended at him or the things he was doing.

In the Gospel according to Saint John, Jesus famously askes his disciples who the people say he is, then he asks them who do you say that I am. (SLIDE) I think that's a great question to ask ourselves this day and every day. Who do we say Jesus is? Is he a prophet, a miracle worker, a great teacher and story teller? Yes, Jesus is all of these, but so much more. When we want a miracle does Jesus always come through the way you think He should? My experience is, the Messiah rarely fits my limited and selfish expectations. I mean, I expect my prayers to be answered in a timely manner and similar to being served at my favorite restaurant, exactly as I ordered. What happens when the answer to our prayers doesn't come in a timely fashion? What about if the thing we thought would make us whole and satisfied doesn't come at all? There have been plenty of times in my life when I became offended with Jesus for these exact reasons. I'm really no different than John... The sad part is that while I'm feeling offended by what I perceive as Jesus not fitting into my mold of what the Messiah should be, I'm missing out on the blessing Jesus really wants me to receive.

Here's what I mean. Years ago when Jr and Laszlo moved here from Wisconsin, PJ and I were so excited. We both looked forward to having family close by who we could do things with. We looked forward to travelling with them and doing so many things together. After they moved here Laszlo almost immediately became sick. All our plans had to be put on hold. I prayed he would get better and we could resume our travel itinerary. Over the course of the next several years both Jr and Laszlo's health deteriorated to the point that they needed a lot of assistance. While I was mostly happy to help them, I also began to resent that our plans for having a lot of fun had been curtailed. When I read the words of Jesus in our text for today, I realized I was not only resentful, but I was offended that God had not seen fit to answer my prayers for health and healing for Laszlo and Jr and for all the fun time we had missed out on. Because of being offended and resentful I missed out on the blessing Jesus had intended for me by being able to more deeply love them at a time in their lives when they really needed my love. That's what happens when we fail to see how Jesus is working in the world. I wanted to have fun like we did in the old days, but Jesus wanted me to learn how to be a better servant. (SLIDE) The wisdom of God is so easily overlooked and the blessing so easily missed. If I had those years to live again, I would still ask for health and healing, but I would be much more receptive to ways I could have brought healing and spent much less time begrudgingly offering my help. Just

because things don't turn out the way you hope and plan, doesn't mean Jesus isn't right there offering the blessings of His Kingdom all along.

John the Baptist came to prepare the way for the Messiah, but the Messiah he got wasn't the one he expected. How about you? Is Jesus the one you have been waiting for or are you still looking for a Messiah that meets your expectations and demands? Sometimes in our offendedness we miss the blessing. (SLIDE) When the great ship, the Titanic was in peril, the captain immediately sent out the SOS signal. The ship, California, was only 10 miles away from the Titanic, but she didn't respond because her radio signal was turned off and her crew couldn't hear the SOS. The Carpathia, on the other hand, was a far greater distance away, but its radio signal was on. That vessel arrived in time to save many lives. When we get so tied up in our own issues and offence at God, it's the same as turning off our radio receivers. What we do about mission and evangelism, the kind of people we are, the kind of church we are is shaped by what we think about Jesus. What we think Christ can do for people will determine how we plan for ministry, and what we think about the grace of Christ will determine the kind of people and church we are. I'm so happy to be among so many of you who have your Jesus radio receivers on and tuned in to Jesus through his Gospel.

John the Baptist expected a Messiah who would come wielding the axe of judgment, (SLIDE) but found instead, the Lord of Grace and love. The question

for us still today is, will we be like those children in the marketplace who refused to play either the dirge of the funeral or the flute of the wedding feast. I want to play along, but my stubborn expectations keep getting in my way. Every once in a while, I get to see a fleeting glimpse of the Kingdom in the way Jesus lived and how he taught. When I'm extremely tuned in with my radio receiver of faith I have even been blessed to see the grace of God right here in this lost and sin sick world. During the times when we ring the bell in front of Walmart before Christmas, I repeatedly see acts of generosity and kindness reflecting the grace and love that Jesus came to usher into our world. I see it all the time at funerals. Our sadness gives way to laughter as funny memories are shared. Maybe we're still way too much like Janis Joplin (SLIDE) who once had a hit song where she prayed, "Oh Lord, won't you buy me a Mercedes Benz," and God laughs...

By way of coming attraction, I've finally settled on our Lenten Video Bible Study. It's by a man named Brant Hansen. He suffers with an eye disorder where his eyes move back and forth constantly. He's also on the autism spectrum. If anyone has reason to be offended at Jesus it would be Brant. Instead of being offended by Jesus or anyone else for that matter, he chooses to be unoffendable. That's the name of the Video Study we're going to discuss on Wednesdays during Lent, "Unoffendable." (SLIDE) We're going to see if there are ways we too can become unoffendable, especially when it comes to our Lord and Savior. I hope

this Bible study helps you as much as it has helped me to see when I'm becoming offended and strategies to overcome our offenses. I think this will be an important study for all of us, if for no other reason, than we live in an age where it seems everyone is offended at someone or something all the time.

One more story about not being offended by grace. (SLIDE) At the funeral of longtime politician Hubert Humphry many years ago all of the national politicians were present. All the living former presidents were in the front row at the funeral. All except for one person who was shunned. This funeral was during President Jimmy Carter's presidency. The disgraced former president Richard Nixon stood up against the wall, all by himself. When it came time for President Carter to enter the sanctuary he walked over to President Nixon, who stood and held out a hand. When Carter approached Nixon he brushed his hand aside and gave him a huge hug, right there for the entire world to see. Then he said, "Welcome back to Washington, Mr. President. That's grace in action!

(SLIDE) May we learn to overcome our perceived offenses from God, from Jesus, and from one another. May we be blessed by God's never-ending Grace and Mercy. May the scandal of God's Grace and His overlooking the sins of many never be offensive, but serve to empower and encourage us to go and do likewise. Amen.
