Theme: Faith Active in Love

Materials: A Sling Shot Like The One David Used

Scripture: 1 John 5:1-6

Hello girls and boys! I hope you all had a great week! I brought a weapon to church with me this morning. I'll tell you what my weapon is later, but first I want to show you my slingshot. I got this when I was visiting Israel several years ago. There's a story in the Bible about someone who used a slingshot just like this one. Can anyone tell me who that was? That's right, it was David. When everyone was afraid of the giant Goliath, Davis put a smooth stone in his slingshot and flung it at him and the giant came tumbling down.

The weapon I brought to church today is much more powerful than this slingshot. In fact, it's the most powerful weapon there is. Our verse today says this weapon will defeat the world. Most people in ancient times and even today still believe the only way to be powerful is to have bigger weapons, but the Bible tells us something different.

When Jesus came and lived here on earth, he showed us another way to be powerful. Jesus showed us that faith acting in love is the only weapon that would one day overcome all the evil and bad things in this world. That's the weapon I brought to Church today. Not a slingshot, or a knife, or even a gun. I brought my faith in Jesus as God's Son and my love for all of you. That's what will change our world!

Let's pray... Dear Jesus, we have the faith and we trust in your word that you are God's Son. Help us to show our faith by acting in love for all of your children. Amen.

A READING OF SCRIPTURE: 1 John 5:1-6

R: Our scripture reading is from 1 John, Chapter 5.

C: Glory to you, O Lord.

5 Everyone who believes that Jesus is the Christ has been born of God, and everyone who loves the parent loves the child. ²By this we know that we love

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the children of God, when we love God and obey his commandments. ³For the love of God is this, that we obey his commandments. And his commandments are not burdensome, ⁴for whatever is born of God conquers the world. And this is the victory that conquers the world, our faith. ⁵Who is it that conquers the world but the one who believes that Jesus is the Son of God?

⁶This is the one who came by water and blood, Jesus Christ, not with the water only but with the water and the blood. And the Spirit is the one that testifies, for the Spirit is the truth.

• SERMON Pr. Mel Musser

Grace and peace to you from God our Father and from the one in whom we trust, Jesus Christ our Lord, amen.

Today's sermon will be rather short so we can have enough time to hear everything our guest, Julie Barhorst has to share with us as the representative from Oesterlen. It's actually very fitting to have her with us today as we consider where and how to fill in the gap in our ministry left when Wernle closed a few months ago. Julie shared quite a lot of information in our Christian Conversations time earlier. One of the reasons I love Trinity so much is your heart for loving and helping our neighbors both near and far. We're a small(ish) congregation, but we have arms that reach out far and wide in love.

The author of First John has a lot to say about love. In First John the author identifies at least two sources or directions of how love flows. First we told our love for our neighbor stems from God first loving us. So, we love only because we

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are loved by God. In today's reading the emphasis changes a bit. The second way our love for each other and our neighbor is possible is because we know and love God. John says if we know God, we'll then love our neighbors. Today we discover that if we love God we'll keep the Commandments and love all of God's children. Our love for others flows from our love for God.

I may be oversimplifying this by quite a bit and it's all quite confusing. Do we love others because God first loved us or do we love others because of our love for God? In the first case love flows from God through us to our neighbors in need and in the second love for our neighbors is sort of a byproduct of our love for God. I might be splitting hairs on this, but it does seem like two different things.

The more I pondered this dilemma the more I began to realize either way, love flows and that's what matters. Verses 4 and 5 remind us, "4for whatever is born of God conquers the world. And this is the victory that conquers the world, our faith. 5Who is it that conquers the world but the one who believes that Jesus is the Son of God?" It reminded me of the saying of Jesus on the night when he was betrayed when he told his disciples to not let their hearts be troubled. He went on to explain that in this world we all would face trouble, but to take heart because He has overcome the world. It really doesn't matter if our love for our neighbor is inspired by God first loving us or if we come to love God and then learn to love our neighbor. What is important is knowing God's Son, our Lord and our Savior,

Jesus Christ. It's Faith in Jesus, the one who has already overcome the world, that enables us to know God, to know God's love, and to love our neighbors as Jesus did. It was your faith in Jesus Christ and the love of God that first motivated this congregation, many years ago, to work so tirelessly for the children of Wernle. Now, it's that same faith and love driving us to find another way to serve God by serving God's Children.

May the love of God fill your hearts to overflowing. May the abundance of love you have find an outlet where each and every one of us can be a blessing to our neighbors. Now, let's discover how we can share our love with our neighbors at Oesterlen. (Julie Barhorst has worked at Oesterlen Services For Youth for over six years and it has become an organization that is very dear to her heart. As an Executive Administrator—Assistant to the CEO and Director of Marketing—she provides administrative support and handles marketing communications and new opportunities for donations and development of church and community relations. Even though she doesn't work directly with the clients, she feels an obligation for Oesterlen to provide its clients with the best services and opportunities. "These kids have had enough disappointments and people they cannot trust in their lives, and we don't want to be one of them." 

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


