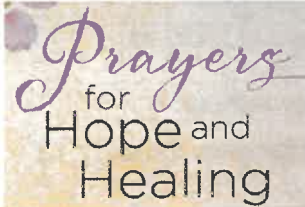

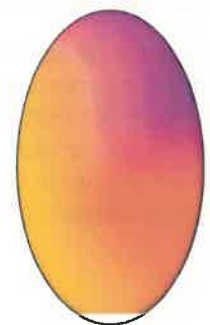
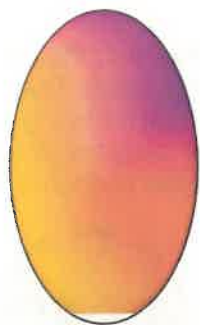

Word from Our Pastor

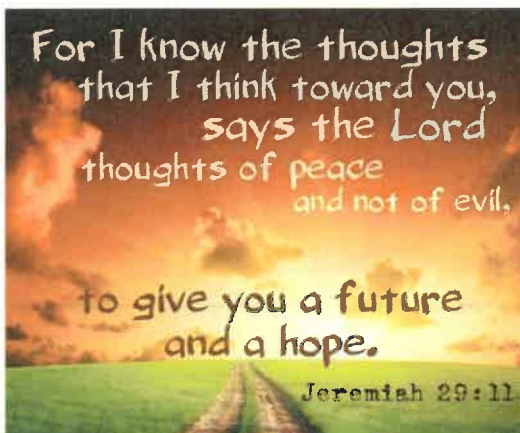

Cold Weather Safety Tips

Well here we are- The true start of the cold weather season. Are you ready?

Frostbite and hypothermia are possible when you are outside, so you need to protect yourself.

1. Wear layers of loose-fitting, lightweight, warm clothing.
2. Wear a hat. Try to stay dry and out of the wind.
3. Cover your mouth to protect your lungs from extreme cold.
4. Mittens, snug at the wrist, are better than gloves.

To keep pipes from freezing on an outside wall:

1. Let hot and cold-water trickle or drip at night from a faucet.
2. Open cabinet doors to allow more heat to get to un-insulated pipes under a sink or near an outer wall.
3. Make sure the heat is left on and set no lower than 55 degrees.
4. If you plan to be away: (1) Have someone, check your house daily to make sure the heat is still on to prevent freezing, or (2) drain and shut off the water system (except indoor sprinkler systems).

If Pipes Freeze:

1. Make sure you and your family know how to shut off the water, in case pipes burst.
2. NEVER try to thaw a pipe with an open flame or torch. Use a hair dryer instead.
3. Always be careful of the potential for electric shock in and around standing water.

Carbon monoxide poisoning is a silent, deadly killer claiming about 1,000 lives each year in the United States.

1. Install a carbon monoxide detector.
2. NEVER run generators indoors.
3. Open a window slightly when using a kerosene heater and follow the manufacturer's instructions.
4. NEVER use a gas oven to heat your home.
5. If your heat goes out, you can keep warm indoors by closing rooms you do not need, dressing in layers of lightweight clothing, and wearing a cap.

Wood-burning stoves, fireplaces and heaters:

1. Always keep a screen around an open flame.
2. NEVER use gasoline to start your fireplace.
3. NEVER burn charcoal indoors.
4. Do not close the damper when the ashes are hot.
5. Use only safe sources of alternative heat such as a fireplace, small well-vented wood or coal stove or portable space heaters. Always follow manufacturer's instructions.

Animal and Pet Safety:

1. Bring pets inside
2. Provide shelter and fresh water
3. Keep salt away from paws

Vehicle Preparation:

1. Check your battery
2. Check your fluids (coolant, wiper fluid, oil, etc)
3. Check your tires
4. Have jumper cables available in your vehicle.
5. Pack a blanket

WELCA CELEBRATES THE MONTH OF DECEMBER

At our December WELCA meeting, the table decorations were done by Portia Boord using the theme of Poinsettias, a popular red and white holiday flower. The flowers were shared with each guest to take home.

Poinsettias are a popular Christmas decoration and symbol of the season for many reasons, including their shape, color, and a Mexican legend.

Star of Bethlehem: The shape of the poinsettia's leaves and flower resembles the Star for Bethlehem, which led the Wise Men to Jesus.

Blood of Christ: The red leaves of the poinsettia are said to represent the blood of Christ shed for the world.

Purity: The white leaves of the poinsettia represent the purity of Christ.

Mexican legend: A Mexican legend tells the story of a poor child who offered weeds to the church altar on Christmas Eve, which miraculously turned into poinsettias. The story highlights the poinsettia's connection to humility and generosity.

December birth flower: Poinsettias are the birth flower for December and symbolize good cheer and success.

Other meanings: Across cultures, poinsettias symbolize birth, hope, and peace.

Poinsettias are known by other names, including Mexican Flame Leaf, Winter Rose, Noche Buena, and Christmas Flower.

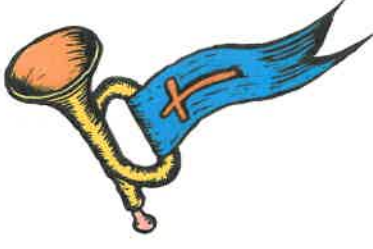
