

I think of them sort of like a good piece of music or a good poem, or painting. I might not be able to say exactly what makes it so good, but I know it when I see or hear it. That's a God moment. I can't tell you exactly what it is, but you know it when you experience one. I've never tried to keep track of them before. I'm still not sure if I'm very good at recognizing them at all... I don't even know how many times per day, week or in a lifetime would be considered normal or average in frequency.

I have a way to go in figuring out my God sighting devotion/research... Anyway, the weather along with so many other things has been up and down so much in the month of March, I'm looking forward to the potential of April, with its flower bringing rains and the promise of the resurrection. Just like it says in Ecclesiastes, there is a time for every matter under heaven. One big event in our family's lives this month is that one of my grandchildren will be getting her drivers license. Yes, we've notified all the regional law enforcement officials, but this is your fair warning. There is or shortly will be a brand new driver on the roads and curbs of Darke and Miami counties... Also, yes, there is a time for every matter. Please take a moment of your time to pray for our new driver and for her mother and grandparents who are worried and anxious.

May you slow down to enjoy every season of the year and of your life. The seasons pass by so quickly, may we cherish the memories we make today. Happy easter!

Care of a Child into Adulthood with Mental and Intellectual Disabilities Pastor Mel and PJ Musser RN (Region 6)

Recently I was asked to share a brief article about caring for our daughter Melanie for the Lutheran Faith Community Nurses Association. I would like to share this article for the Health Ministry article this month. Believe me when I say it was hard to keep it short! Pastor Mel had to help me edit it down.

Our daughter Melanie will be 44 years old this month. We were going to be first time parents, and our dreams of a growing family were just beginning. When Melanie came along things were different. The extent of Melanie's disabilities only became apparent gradually, over time. At first, we were informed she only had 2 vessels in her umbilical cord rather than the normal three and she only had 4 toes on her right foot. Later, we were informed she had a transposition of the great vessels of her heart. Thankfully she has never needed heart surgery. She continues to see a pediatric heart specialist. Melanie was classified as microcephalic.



The pediatrician said it was nothing to worry about. All this came very piecemeal, so, we had Melanie tested by a developmental specialist. We thought there might be malpractice involved. Sadly, most medical professionals are uncomfortable telling parents "bad news". We were informed by the lawyers Melanie was mentally retarded and only the future would determine what her abilities would be. Even though they said she would not be able to talk, we didn't give up on getting Melanie to try to use her words. She has a small vocabulary. Small gains were huge for us.

As she grew, we had to remain in a constant state of alertness. Melanie was either trying to wander off, put stuff in her ears, or do tasks she was learning at school. We thought she would live with us forever. As she got older, we realized this was naïve. After Melanie graduated from high school, we discovered Towards Independence Inc. (TII) and she moved into a small group home at the age of 23. Melanie remained with TII until last year when her medical condition worsened. She was able move into a skilled nursing facility for long term care - or so we thought. The Ohio Board of Developmental Disabilities is now requiring her to be placed back into an intermediate care facility. We are in the process of appealing.

When you have a disabled child, you're never finished being their advocate! Be prepared to be in it for the long haul...

Unexpectant lessons we learned along the way:

- Don't focus on what could have been or you'll miss the joy in front of you
- Don't assume the physician knows everything
- Don't do things for your disabled child until they try it for themselves
- ♦ It's ok if people stare maybe they have questions
- ◆ Get guardianship!
- ♦ Make your long-term care plans
- Stay involved! Go to physician appointments and therapy appointments
- ◆ Educate others how to communicate with your child don't allow anyone to talk down to them
- Healthcare providers should talk to their patient first! Then they can talk to family
- ♦ You are your child's best advocate!!!


