CHILDREN'S MESSAGE



Theme: The Greatest Gift

Materials: One Christmas Present wrapped with bright

paper and one wrapped in plain brown paper

Scripture: Luke 1:26-56

Hello boys and girls! Merry Christmas, well almost... This is the last Sunday before Christmas. Are you excited? I am! Today I brought 2 different Christmas presents. If I let you pick one present, which one would you rather have? Would you rather have this brightly colored fancily wrapped package, or this one wrapped in plain brown paper?

Let's pass around this package and when it gets to you, call out one of your favorite things to receive as a present. (Allow each child to participate. Give a five-second time limit to speed up the process.)

On Christmas morning, we may wake up to find brightly colored packages tied up with pretty ribbons and bows. If on Christmas morning, you found a package with your name on it that was wrapped in plain brown paper and tied up with string, what might be your reaction? (Pause.) We might not be excited about a package like that.

Maybe that's why so many people have missed out on God's gift that we celebrate at Christmas. God's gift of Jesus, His only Son, didn't come in fancy wrapping. Jesus' mother was a very young girl... His earthly father was a poor carpenter... He was born in a stable not in a fancy house or even a big hospital. Not a very pretty package, is it? (Pause.) Despite the wrapping, Jesus is the greatest gift the world has ever known. He offered us forgiveness and eternal life with God!

The Bible tells us when Mary found out she was chosen to deliver God's gift to the world, she was filled with joy. She hurried to Elizabeth's home to share the good news. Elizabeth was also going to have a baby, and when she heard the news, the Bible says the baby she was carrying "leaped" inside of her! She exclaimed in a loud voice, "Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the child you will bear! You are blessed because you believed that the Lord would do what He said."

Through Jesus, God sent us the gift of His love, but some people are so busy unwrapping the beautifully wrapped packages this world offers that they have missed out on the greatest gift of all.

Dear Father, we are thankful that You loved us so much that You sent Your only Son to be our Savior. May we never miss out on the greatest gift of all time, your son, Jesus. In Jesus' name, amen.

• A READING OF SCRIPTURE: Luke 1:26-56

R: The Holy Gospel according to Luke, the first chapter.

C: Glory to you, O Lord.

²⁶In the sixth month the angel Gabriel was sent by God to a town in Galilee called Nazareth, ²⁷to a virgin engaged to a man whose name was Joseph, of the house of David. The virgin's name was Mary. ²⁸And he came to her and said, "Greetings, favored one! The Lord is with you." ²⁹But she was much perplexed by his words and pondered what sort of greeting this might be. ³⁰The angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God. ³¹And now, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you will name him Jesus. ³²He will be great, and will be called the Son of the Most High, and the Lord God will give to him the throne of his ancestor David. ³³He will reign over the house of Jacob forever, and of his kingdom there will be no end." ³⁴Mary said to the angel, "How can this be, since I am a virgin?" ³⁵The angel said to her, "The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you; therefore the child to be born will be holy; he will be called Son of God. ³⁶And now, your relative Elizabeth in her old age has also conceived a son; and this is the sixth month for her who was said to be barren. ³⁷For nothing will be impossible with God." ³⁸Then Mary said, "Here am I, the servant of the Lord; let it be with me according to your word." Then the angel departed from her.

³⁹In those days Mary set out and went with haste to a Judean town in the hill country, ⁴⁰where she entered the house of Zechariah and greeted Elizabeth. ⁴¹When Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the child leaped in her womb. And Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit ⁴²and exclaimed with a loud cry, "Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb. ⁴³And why has this happened to me, that the mother of my Lord comes to me? ⁴⁴For as soon as I heard the sound of your greeting, the child in my womb leaped for joy. ⁴⁵And blessed is she who believed that there would be a fulfillment of what was spoken to her by the Lord."

⁴⁶And Mary said, "My soul magnifies the Lord, ⁴⁷and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior, ⁴⁸for he has looked with favor on the lowliness of his servant. Surely, from now on all generations will call me blessed; ⁴⁹for the Mighty One has done great things for me, and holy is his name. ⁵⁰His mercy is for those who fear him from generation to generation. ⁵¹He has shown strength with his arm; he has scattered the proud in the thoughts of their hearts. ⁵²He has brought down the powerful from their thrones, and lifted up the lowly; ⁵³he has filled the hungry with good things, and sent the rich away empty. ⁵⁴He has helped his servant Israel, in remembrance

of his mercy, ⁵⁵according to the promise he made to our ancestors, to Abraham and to his descendants forever." ⁵⁶And Mary remained with her about three months and then returned to her home.

C: Praise to You, O Christ (Spoken)

• SERMON Pr. Mel Musser

Grace and peace to you from God our Father and from the one born to turn the world upside down, our Savior, Jesus Christ, amen.

(SLIDE) Of all the people God could have chose to bear the Messiah, God chose Mary. We don't really know all that much about Mary. Historians believe she was a peasant girl, probably a teenager at the time she was first visited by the Angel Gabriel. Imagine how afraid Mary would have been. First of all, this wasn't just any old apparition. This was the Archangel of Gooodddd! (SLIDE) The news Gabriel brought was even more frightening. Imagine being told you were going to have a baby, but you didn't have a husband. Now today that would be no big deal. It happens all the time, but in those days girls who got pregnant outside of wedlock were stoned to death. Let that sink in for a minute... (SLIDE) Your family and people you thought were your friends picking up rocks the size of softballs and throwing them at you until your bones were broken and your skull smashed. Not a very pleasant prospect for Mary to say the least. Yet Gabriel tells Mary she has been favored by God. I know what I would have been thinking...

"If that's what being highly favored means, give me a little less favor, if you please..." Mary was one strong, independent woman inside that teenage girl's body! Her reaction wasn't, "how can I get out of this," but just the opposite, "Here am I, the servant of the Lord; let it be with me according to your word." (SLIDE)

Mary visited her cousin, Elizabeth and confirmed the Archangel's announcement. She resolves to follow all that the Lord had in mind for her. After pondering her situation and what God was doing, she proclaims some of the most beautiful words in all of scripture. Her song has been known for centuries as "The Magnificat." (SLIDE) In it she has the audacity to claim that her soul magnifies the Lord. Mary says for all the world, including you and me, that her soul makes God larger, like a magnifying glass... What she means, of course, is that through her life, we can closely examine God and see God even more clearly. Because of Mary, we get a close up picture of God's character. We get a better understanding of who and what God favors. In the Magnificat, Mary is envisioning and voicing a vision of a world where the lowly are recognized as having value. She can see on the horizon the structure for a world where food and wealth are not hoarded by a handful of rich people, but shared equitably. Where those who try to enlarge themselves by cutting others down find their thoughts scattered and impotent. What a wonderful world that would be.

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I like to think of this fairly long scripture reading in movements. Mary moves from being perplexed to pondering, to probing, to finally permission giving. When the Archangel first appears to her, Mary is quite naturally perplexed. (SLIDE) Probably terrified. The Greek word we have translated as perplexed also means greatly disturbed, confused, or thrown into disarray. Mary's life was completely turned upside down. Then she began to ponder, or do what I like to call process the situation. The Greek word means she began to debate with herself about what this meant. What does it mean that a teenage girl, someone the culture of the time discounted as a nothing and a nobody, was highly favored by God. That one statement alone tells us our worldly values are at odds with God's will. Mary recognizes this fact when she says in her Magnificat, God, "has looked with favor on the lowliness of his servant." She later says God, "has brought down the powerful from their thrones, and lifted up the lowly..."

Back then as now, we still believe God's blessings include wealth, power, and giving some people a strong voice to make policies and laws. Mary tells us something different. By selecting Mary, out of all the women who have ever lived, God is revealing to the world God's favor rests on those who have no wealth, no power, and no voice in society. It's a topsy, tervy world, or maybe it's not God's world that's topsy-tervy, it's our sin scarred and broken world we should be taking

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a second look at. So, first Mary is perplexed, then she ponders and processes the information. As she's pondering and debating with herself what this all could mean, she has a question for the Archangel. (SLIDE) She begins to probe a little deeper. How can this be, since I have not ever been with a man and I have never committed adultery? Gabriel offers her reassurance and a bit of proof. He tells Mary about Elizabeth and her miraculous conception and leaves her with the promise that nothing is impossible with God. With that reassurance, Mary moves into the final act of this story where she gives permission for God to use her to bring God's Son into the world. (SLIDE) Mary wasn't forced into something she didn't want on couldn't handle. She moved from being perplexed, to pondering, through a process of probing how this would all take place, to acceptance and permission granting.

Mary was a perfect disciple, prophet, and mother. Most of the time we only see Mary from one aspect of her character. We most often think of her as the mother of Jesus. In most of the pictures and icons of her, she's sweet, loving, and almost always white. The truth would have been significantly different. She was a tough, strong willed woman who knew the plan God had for her and lived into God's will. She must have been a marvelous woman of great faith. Without great faith she would have never noticed the Archangel Gabriel. She learned what God

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had in store for her and that made her a great disciple. By her pondering and her probing she was given insights that revealed God's true values. The strength of her character allowed her to overcome her fear and proclaim those values for all generations to come after her. Yes, Mary was the mother of our Lord, but she was oh, so much more!

As we move from being perplexed to pondering what all this means for us today, we can learn from Mary. If God favors the lowly, the powerless, and those with no voice in how society functions, then perhaps those are the very people God calls us to focus our attention on as well. (SLIDE) Jesus echoed these very same values from the Sermon on the Mount when he said blessed are the poor, the weak, those who mourn. He added blessed are you who give mercy, who are peacemakers, and those who hunger and thirst for righteousness. From my processing of what all this means, I can say with surety, God most certainly favors the poor, the meek, and the lowly. God also favors those who assist and provide for the poor the meek and the lowly. That's why we're in the business of ministry and where the focus of our ministry most closely aligns with the will of God.

May we learn from Mary what God's values are and how to respond when God calls your name. May we never forget God's values are different and sometimes at odds with the values we think are normal. May we always place the

lifting up of those who are at the bottom of the rung on the social ladder as our highest goal and priority. May God continue to bless us when we share our blessings with those God highly favors. May we find in Mary a wonderful example of disciple, prophet, and mother of our Lord, amen.

* NICENE CREED

The Nicene Creed is said on all festivals and on Sundays in the seasons of Advent, Christmas, Lent, and Easter. The Apostles' Creed is said at other times. The Creed is omitted here if the service of Holy Baptism or another rite with a creed is used.

C: We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven; by the power of the Holy Spirit he became incarnate from the virgin Mary, and was made man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son. With the Father and the Son he is worshiped and glorified. He has spoken through the prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

Or, He descended to the dead.


