

For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life. (John. 3:16)

To the Saints at Trinity, Grace and Peace to you from God our Father and from our Savior, Jesus Christ, amen.

February is the month for love! What better way to start a month than with this most famous Bible verse. An awful lot of thoughts and ink have been spent on this one verse over the years. Martin Luther called John 3:16 the Gospel in a nutshell. In this single verse we learn what kind of a God we have and what God's intentions are for all of humanity. God loves you and wants you to spend forever with Him. When I was young, I thought I knew what love was. I mean, I loved my mom and dad. I loved my sisters. I definitely loved pizza and ice cream! Yet, I

had no idea that I would experience a whole new level of love when our first

baby was born. When I first laid eyes on Melanie, I thought my heart was going to burst right out of my chest. I loved our little girl that much! I knew right then I would do anything for her.

God feels the same way about you and me. God also loves the animals of the forest and the fish in the oceans. God loved the trees and the clouds. God loves the air that we breath and the dirt under our feet. God loves it all because God created it all. For us humans, love is usually thought of as a feeling or an emotion. God doesn't think of love in the same way. For God, love is a verb. It's an action word. Did you notice in our theme verse it says God so loved the world that He gave... When God loves someone or something there is always action.



This month we celebrate and remember Saint Valentine. There is a lot of ambiguity surrounding exactly who Saint Valentine actually was, but the ancient Church records do record some pretty amazing things about a Bishop of Terni, an important town of Umbria, in central Italy. The bishop was arrested for evangelizing and his case eventually made it to the local judge, who took a liking to him. He told Valentinus (the Latin version of his name) if he could bring sight to his blind daughter, he would let him go free. Valentinus laid hands on the girl and prayed to God for her sight. The girl was given her vision and the judge kept his promise. In fact, the judge and his entire family and all his servants were baptized. However, Bishop Valentinus was later arrested again for the same offense and this time he didn't fare guite as well. He was brought before the Roman Emperor Claudius IV who ordered him to be beaten and beheaded outside of Rome on February 14 in the year 269. The Feast of Saint Valentine, also known as Saint Valentine's Day, was established by Pope Gelasius I in AD 496 to be celebrated on February 14 in honor of the Christian martyr.

Today, when we say we love someone, we might mean we feel a certain way, but the way we show our love is much the same as the way God shows us God's love for us. We give. We give chocolates on Valentines Day as a way to show our loved one the way we feel inside. We love by taking after the one who loved us first, our Father in Heaven. Our Father didn't hold back a single thing, but instead, gave us the best he had, his only begotten Son, Jesus Christ. As we celebrate Valentine's Day this month, let us remember that when we love someone, we give the best of ourselves, not just what we can spare or what's left over after we've given to everyone and everything else.

May your Valentine's Day be filled with love and may our God's love always serve as our example of how to love each other. Happy Valentine's Day!

Emergency Readiness

Severe weather and disasters can happen at any time without notice or warning. Would you be ready? Severe thunderstorms, wildfires, heatwaves/drought, floods, winter storms, cold waves/freezes, hurricanes, and tornadoes are natural disasters that occur throughout the United States.

Having an annual emergency plan is key to ensuring your family's safety during these events.

Here are a few things to remember with the help from the government.

Make an emergency plan and practice it

- It's best to plan this with your family so everyone will know what to do in the event of an actual emergency.
- Create an evacuation route plan that includes what to do if the family isn't all together.
- Build an emergency preparedness kit with food, water, medicines, and supplies to last for a few days.
- Small and large pets also need a plan to stay safe. Make sure to have extra food and animal supplies available in your kit.

Stay connected

- Communications can be unreliable during times of emergencies. It's critical to have many ways to receive alerts
- Download the FEMA and Red Cross applications on your smartphone to get storm alerts in real-time.
- Sign up for email alerts from your local authorities and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC).
- Get a battery-operated portable radio in the event of a loss of electricity.

Prepare your home

- Secure any loose items such as hanging gutters and cut down hanging tree limbs.
- Consider flood insurance if you live in a flood-prone area. Not all homeowner or renter insurance policies cover damages from floodwaters.
- Make copies of important documents like your driver's license, Social Security card, and insurance policies. Add them to your emergency kit.
- Sign up to receive electronic payments for Social Security and other benefits to avoid potential lapses in the mail service.

Consider any special circumstances

Continue to adapt your plans according to your needs and family. Growing your family, taking care of a loved one, and getting older can present unique accommodations that you should prepare for ahead of any emergency.

- If you are pregnant, know where to go for prenatal care during an emergency. Talk to your health provider about your options in case of hospital or office closure.
- Are you someone with a disability or a caregiver? Keep extra medicines, medical equipment and devices, alternative ways of communicating your needs. Consult your medical providers on any other possible support needed.
- Consider your needs as a senior like transportation and access to services and reliable emergency contacts to help you act before an emergency.

So, are you ready for the unexpected? With the current concern in California with the multiple wildfires- I began to think (this is dangerous). What do I value? Who do I love? What would make me heartbroken if I lost a certain possession? Would I be ready? Am I ready?

Well, I can not speak for anyone else but myself- I think I better get ready for the unexpected!


Above all, when nothing less would save people, ancient and modern, from the dangers of sin and death, God came to us as Jesus.
