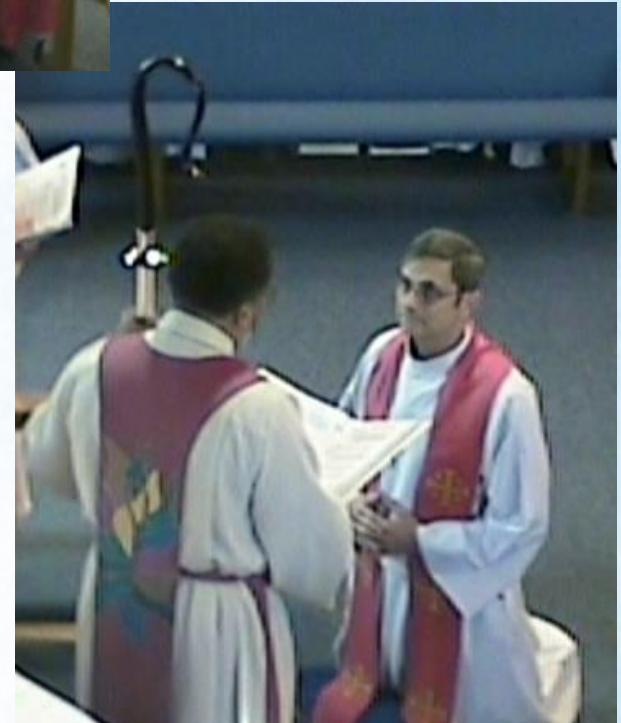


Joy at war's end: an airman from the 1st Tactical Fighter Wing shares the homecoming warmth with a happy crowd at Langley Air Force Base in Virginia
